- 2.3 Are you hopeful for environmental justice? What are you drawn to do in response?
- 3.1 CST encourages subsidiarity, that actions should occur on the most local level possible. How do these gardens and donations honor that?
- 3.2 How does care for God's Creation relate to the integral actions of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy?
- 3.3 Care for God's Creation is often associated with consumption, pollution, and waste. What is the relevance of animals, insects, and plant life? How do these factor into our good stewardship?
