- 2.2 If you had to organize and lead a public demonstration today, what marginalized group or social injustice would you want to highlight? What realities would you want to highlight and amplify by your action?
- 2.3 Viatorians strive to stand up for and walk with people who society tries to account of little importance. How does public demonstration live out this integral call?
- 3.1 What do you remember about your first experiences of direct service? What did you first learn or realize by spending time in service?
- 3.2 In your experience serving, where have you served? Who were the clients or community in need? What did they show or teach you, even if they're realizations you only have looking back?
- 3.3 Have you ever carefully considered how people on the edges are just as much your sisters and brothers as your own family members? How does this attitude and outlook affect your consideration of these people?



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
